

Rape Prevention Education Program- Statistics

- 1 in 4 women have been survivors of rape or attempted rape.
 - 84% of those raped knew their attacker.
 - 57% of the rapes happened on dates.
- 42% of the rape survivors told no one about the assault
 - Only 5% reported it to the police.
- In a recent U.C.L.A. study 65% of college males said they would rape a woman if they thought they could get away with it.
